

Judging by social media, one magical piece of produce is on our minds each year when autumn hits: pumpkin. Pumpkin coffee, pumpkin spice, pumpkin pie — pumpkin everything! 

SHOULD YOU CONSOLIDATE **RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS?**

One of the rewards for working over several decades is the ability to contribute to tax-advantaged retirement accounts, which can help provide needed income for you when you do retire. As the years went by, you may well have accumulated several retirement accounts, such as IRAs and 401(k)s or similar employer-sponsored plans. But you might find it advantageous to consolidate these accounts with a single provider.

Consolidating them can provide you with several potential benefits, including these:

- * Less confusion and clutter: If you have multiple accounts in different locations, it may be difficult to keep track of tax documents, statements, fees, disclosures and other important information. Consolidating accounts could help provide clear, simplified account maintenance.
- * Less likelihood of "lost accounts": It may be hard to believe, but many people abandon their retirement accounts, leaving thousands of dollars behind and unclaimed. In fact, at the end of 2021, there were nearly 25 million forgotten 401(k) accounts, worth about 20% of all 401(k) assets, according to an estimate by Capitalize, a financial services company that helps individuals roll over retirement plan assets into new accounts. It's possible that employers can even move small, old accounts out of their 401(k) plans and into an IRA on behalf of their former employees, thus increasing the chances that savers will lose track of their money. By consolidating your retirement plans with one provider, you can ensure you don't lose track of your hard-earned money.
- * Ability to follow a unified strategy: With multiple retirement accounts, and different investment portfolios, you might find it difficult to maintain a unified financial strategy that's appropriate for your goals and risk tolerance. But once you've consolidated accounts with a single provider, you'll find it easier to manage your investment mix and to rebalance your portfolio as needed. The need to rebalance may become more important as you near retirement because you may want to shift some of your assets into investments that aren't as susceptible to swings in the financial markets.
- * Possible improvement in investment options: Often, 401(k) s may have limited investment selection, so consolidating accounts with a full-service firm may allow for a wider array of products and strategies. This broader exposure can potentially help you improve your overall retirement income strategies.

* Greater ease in calculating RMDs: Once you turn 72, you will need to start taking withdrawals — called required minimum distributions, or RMDs — from your traditional IRA and your 401(k) or similar plan. If you don't take out at least the minimal amount, which is based on your age and account balance, you could face a penalty. If you have several accounts, with different providers, it could be cumbersome and difficult to calculate your RMDs — it will be much easier with all accounts under one roof.

So, if you do have multiple retirement accounts, give some thought to consolidating them. The consolidation process is not difficult, and the end result may save you time and hassles while also helping you manage your retirement income more effectively.

RESIDENT RECIPE LOCAL GUIDE

Jennifer's Jambalaya



INGREDIENTS

- 2-3 red/yellow/green peppers (your choice), chopped into bite-size pieces
- 2 onions, chopped into bite-size pieces
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- Several stalks of celery, chopped into bite-size pieces
- Whole chicken, cut into serving size portions
- 1 cup long-grain white rice
- Chipotle or other sausage, approximately 1 pound, chopped into bite-size pieces

INSTRUCTIONS

- Season chicken generously with poultry seasoning, salt, pepper, parsley, sage, rosemary and thyme.
- Melt oil or butter in a large deep-frying pan or Creuset-type pot on medium heat and brown chicken (don't cook all the way through). Remove chicken from pan.
- Add all veggies and garlic to pan and cook for just a few minutes.
- Add rice to pan and 2 cups water.
- Lay all chicken pieces on top, add lid and cook for 10 minutes.
- Add sausage. Keep lid on and cook until rice absorbs all water.
- Keep stirring up from bottom so it doesn't burn, still on medium heat.
- Depending on size of pot, this can take 20-30 minutes to absorb all the water.
- This is a mild jambalaya based loosely on *The Joy of Cooking* cookbook. You can add spices to turn up the heat, like chili powder.



delivery program Emergency Food Network. Emergency Food Network, for those who aren't familiar, is Pierce County's nonprofit food distributor. That means that they distribute food to over 70 partner programs across Pierce County. Some are in downtown Tacoma; some are all the way out to the edges of the county and rural areas and everywhere in between.

Marissa is originally from the South Sound; she was born in Gig Harbor and then suburb-hopped through high school, living in Puyallup, Lacey and Parkland. Marissa learned about Emergency

Food Network when she returned to the South Sound after living in California for a while. She came home and decided that she wanted to do good locally as the next step in her career. That's when she stumbled across the Emergency Food Network.

Marissa found out that they were hiring AmeriCorps members to work in their newly formed home delivery program. Once she applied, she fell in love with the organization and the people behind it. "I saw everyone just so completely dedicated to getting food to the people who needed it."

Emergency Food Network's mission is to provide Pierce County with a nutritious, diverse and consistent food supply so that no person goes hungry. The homedelivery program is designed to serve those folks who have barriers to accessing their local food pantries and our partner programs. So, they reach out and serve those folks who have barriers, including limited transportation and limited mobility — they might have a prohibitive work schedule.

In addition to home delivery, EFN also has Mother Earth Farm out in the Puyallup valley, where they use organic practices to grow food that then goes directly from our fields to our partner programs or to home delivery. Last year, 80,000 pounds of produce farmed by EFN volunteers and staff left the field and went into someone's shopping bag. The folks at EFN are passionate about having fresh, healthy and local food options for the community.



2021, when they completed 900 deliveries in one month.

There have been lots of changes that the delivery team has implemented since the beginning — one is how they pack each box. "We now pack our own boxes of food. We no longer purchase a pre-packed box; we get to select every item that goes into a box. And we get to change that selection from month to month to be more responsive to folks' needs and requests." For example, around the holidays, they included stuffing in the boxes, which is often a holiday staple for folks.

Marissa explained what inspired her to get involved with EFN. "When I learned about EFNs farm, I think that that showed to me just how creative and committed EFN is serving those folks experiencing food insecurity. EFN doesn't just send any old food to folks. EFN is committed to sending the most nutritious and diverse food to folks experiencing food insecurity. That was really moving to me that we have a whole group of staff members and volunteers who are committed to the freshest and the most nutritious food grown right here."

Marissa is beyond grateful for her opportunity to work with Emergency Food Network and help the organization grow. "There are so many groups and people who want to care for their neighbors and feed their neighbors in need. And I'm so grateful that I get to keep learning about who our programs are and what brings them to us. It's amazing to hear stories from all these people. And I'm grateful that I get to hear them and learn."

She wants to encourage everyone to find a small way to get involved in their community. For young people, she thinks getting experience in a nonprofit environment would be a great way to kickstart any career.

"I think that a career in the nonprofit world really builds on a passion and a heart, and it builds on people skills. So, as much as you can, develop those skills by getting involved in an opportunity near you. I think that that will really deepen your passion, and it will prepare you for your career."

BOWLED OVER: BOMFED OVER:

TACOMA'S PAST MEETS PRESENT THROUGH AN UNLIKELY SPORT

near the intersection at Yakima, you will find a portal back in time. On any given Tuesday or Thursday (sometimes Saturdays and on Wednesdays during league play), on the lawn bowling green on Sixth Avenue, you'll find the Tacoma Lawn Bowling Club. The club was formed in 1929 and the green laid a few years later in 1936. Club membership started to trail, and the club began to decline in the mid-200s, until, in 2017, Kane Tobin revamped the club, according to

lawn bowling but saw this green and that created the spark. "Kane took it upon himself to learn about lawn bowling, learn about how to revamp this club, and he's done an excellent job in terms of getting us to where we are now," Laura says. It was Kane, too, who started the learn to bowl classes, the club's summertime five-week course that teaches students the art and sport of lawn bowling. The class meets on Tuesdays and Fridays and compete in a tournament on the final Saturday following the last class. And if you have the drive to compete, there are several tournaments including a triples tournament. But Laura notes it is a very friendly game, "especially if you're a good sport."



Lawn bowling is a sport that's played around the world. But here in the Northwest Division there are five lawn bowling clubs -- Portland, one in King City, the one up in Jefferson Park, Spokane and Tacoma.

The basics of lawn bowling are as follows according to Laura:


The game is played on a green. "You can kind of look at it as a golfing green. Metro Parks maintains the green. They do an excellent job," she says. In that vein, while there are no hallmark bowling shoes, like in golf a certain shoe, in this case flat shoes, are required to maintain the green. But unlike golf, there is no uniform per se. "A lot of people in summertime, bowl barefoot, a lot of people in Australia do that as well. In years past a lot of people looked at lawn bowling as you always must wear white-that was the traditional view. We don't really have that tradition ...for a tournament, a lot of us coordinate colors together on teams."

So now that you have an outfit, how does one actually play?

Basically, you have a small little ball called a jack, and the goal is to get your bowl (the ball—yes, the ball is called a bowl), closest to the jack and that's how you earn points. The interesting thing about lawn bowling is you don't throw it -- you roll it down the green -- and it has a bias to it, so, it's weighted differently on one side than the other. Depending on how you want to reach the jack, you'll use your bowl differently. To win, you need to earn the set number of points first, for example if you are playing to 10, whoever earns 10 points first is the victor. I "It's an easy sport to learn, but in turn, it takes good eye hand coordination, but it takes a long time to develop a skill to be able to play it at a higher level." Laura notes there are similarities to another popular game — "in terms of how the game is played, people say it's like curling on grass."

Laura, a massage therapist, found lawn bowling by happenstance. Laura moved from Alaska to Tacoma in 2019. Weary of the sixmonths-long winters and driving snow, they relocated and stumbled upon a shared passion in the proves. "In the first week, we were here we were walking around Wright Park and saw what looked to be a lawn bowling green. My husband is from Australia, we knew what a lawn bowling green looked like. We started doing a little research, at that moment, it just so turned out that there was a class that was coming up. We just signed up to see what it's like. That's how we got involved." Michael Catsi, Laura's husband of more than 30 years serves as the club's treasurer. "I never, in a million years, thought that when I moved down here from Alaska, I would be president of a sports club."

Aside from the enjoyment of the sport is the community, Laura says. "It's another way of getting people together to do something that they love doing. Here we are in this



beautiful park, this historic park, that a lot of people maybe don't realize it's such a great asset to this community. If you wander around that park and think about its history, it's amazing." And unlike many sports, Laura notes, "the beauty of this sport is that it's it really is for all ages. I feel like I'll probably be playing this for a

very long time."

The Tacoma Lawn Bowling Club just wrapped their season, which runs from April through the end of October. But it's not too early to reach out for the 2023 season.

Membership is \$120.
